PREPARING FOR YOUR PURPOSE

Jeremiah 29:11 tells us that God has plans for us. Like a master architect, he has envisioned, created and designed you for a divine purpose. You may be a "bridge," commissioned and strategically placed, to connect thousands of people back to Christ. You may be a skyscraper, bringing together resources or championing causes for Christ, or you may be a well, a source of refreshment and RESTORATION for the

RESTORATION— for the lost and broken. No matter what kind of future God has planned for you, you have two responsibilities after you answer that call: to prepare for your purpose in every possible way, and to continue to build your life on a firm foundation, so that you can stand firm against every challenge that lies ahead.

A FIRM FOUNDATION

Every great building begins with a great foundation.

Jesus tells the story of two builders; one foolish, one very wise. They both began to build their buildings. The first builder began his building right there on the sand. The sand was smooth and easy to make level. He cleared the ground and began to build. One wall, then two, pretty soon it was built. Last of all he placed the roof and there it stood, a thing of beauty! And then the second builder began

building his building. He dug away the sand and found the solid bedrock beneath. On this bedrock he began to build a solid foundation; with concrete, brick, mortar, until finally the foundation was complete. The first builder laughed to himself as he figured the time it took. "I built my house in half the time and he's not even begun the walls!" he exclaimed with great smugness. Then the second builder began to build the walls and the roof and finally he was finished. The house looked identical to the first house, but it took much longer to build.

That night, the clouds became thick and dark and the winds began to blow. The first builder's house began to sway back and forth with the winds as the sand shifted, but the second house never moved. And then the rains came. They poured on both houses with great force, the ground became wet and the streams began to flow. With a great snap, wood began to break as the first house's foundation began to wash away. But the second house was unmoved. It stood the test of wind and rain, flood and storm.

Jesus said that we are builders and our buildings are our life-our character.

MATTHEW 7:24-27 (KJV)

"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man

who built his house on a rock.

And the rain came down, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house.
And it did not fall, for it was founded on a rock.

And everyone who hears these sayings of Mine and does not do them shall be compared to a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain came down, and the floods came, and the wind blew and beat on that house. And it fell, and great was its fall."

The more our life is built on God's word, the more we are able to weather the storms of life and be strong men.

If you spend time every morning being intimate with God, you will never be intimidated by men. You will carry God's strength into every situation.

At Men of Honor Camp, you will find, every morning, young men, by themselves, underneath trees, behind rocks and all over the camp seeking God during their quiet time. They have found the secret to powerful manhood, linking up with the creator of all men.

Start each day in God's word. Spend the first of every day in prayer, downloading God's blessing for your life, His strength to face the giants.

Your foundation is built every morning when you give God the

first part of every day.

There is a principle in the Bible that is very important to understand. I believe it is the most important principle in the Bible. It is called the tithe. I know, you might be thinking that I'm talking about money, but it is so much more than that. The tithe means giving God what is His, the first part, the best part of everything.

There was once a young man in our church youth group named J.T. He was a special young man. Everyone liked him and he was a natural leader. One year after a youth conference, J.T. made an amazing vow to God. J.T vowed to tithe or give the first part of his teen years to God. He vowed not to date girls for one year! For some guys this would be easy, but J.T. had girls calling him all the time.

When you give God the first of anything, he will bless the rest and make it greater than it would have been otherwise.

After J. T's year was up God had blessed his life in an unbelievable way; His musical talents were exploding. He was writing and recording songs, performing in many new venues and would soon become a talented and rising star.

Tithing can include giving God

the first of your money, the first of your day, the first few weeks of every year, or the first of your teen years. Either way, God will honor those who Honor Him. The first and the best belong to God; He will not take second place in your life. He is either Lord of all, or not Lord at all.

Now maybe you have neglected to place God in first place in your life. If so, it's not too late to begin. Ask God to forgive you, look for opportunities to put God first in EVERY thing and get ready for your life to be blessed!

What sort of a man will you be?

2Ti 2:20 (KJV) But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and of silver, but also of wood and of earth; and some to honor, and some to dishonor.

2Timothy 2:21 (KJV) Therefore if anyone purges himself from these, he shall be a vessel to honor, sanctified and useful to the Master, prepared for every good work.

You can choose to be an ordinary man or an extraordinary man. You can be one who gives God much to be proud of or one of his many disappointments.

My dad taught me when I was a boy, "Son, if you're going

to be a bear, be a Grizzly bear!" What this meant is that I needed to be all that I could be.

Push the envelope

In order to become a Man of Honor, you will need to exceed the crowd in your pursuits of righteousness. What I mean is, you will have to make a deliberate decision to make choices that honor God and look for ways to Honor God in every decision. What may seem like work in the beginning will become a habit that will launch your life into a pattern of blessing and success. Jesus said,



Remember to feed your "spirit man" with good things every day to strengthen these gifts, and to consider your spiritual gifts as first and foremost in the direction of vour life.


ALIGN your education, your activities and your student life choices with your spiritual gifts, so that you can use them fully for God's glory. For instance, if you seem to be destined for ministry, you might join the debate team to build your public speaking skills. If your calling points to some kind of leadership, get involved with student council. If you have a gift for recognizing and pushing for positive changes, find a community service organization to join. In all of these, you will build networks with older leaders who will pour into you and assist you with reaching your goals.

RESEARCH. What are the best colleges or trade schools to equip you for your purpose? Is there a mentorship organization of some kind that might help connect you with the right scholarship resources to get there? Read about the requirements for that kind of career, and ask those who have lived it, what is it like?

JOURNAL. Faithfully record the details of your explorations, thoughts, setbacks, achievements... all of it! Take time to review, reflect and pray over your progress as you ask God for further direction. Share your writings with your mentor and ask for honest feedback and advice.

KEEP IT REAL. Remember what a wise man once said: "Sometimes your talents will take you to places your character cannot sustain you." As you discover and develop your gifts and talents, keep your ego in check. Don't get "full of yourself" and forget that you're good at it (whatever it is) not only because you have practiced and pursued it with excellence, but because, after all, it was a GIFT - given to you by God, to be used for his purpose and his glory, not your own. Be humble. Don't let it go to your head. Always point the applause back to God, and praise him for the opportunity to do something for him.

LIFE SKILLS

A man is never truly a man until he is self-sufficient. This does not mean that he does not need family or friends to rely upon in difficult times, but that, on a day-to-day basis, he knows how to take care of himself--to be respectable and responsible.

For instance, a young man who relies on his parents to cook all his meals, do his laundry and make his bed, is not a man; he's still a boy. A young man who has not learned how to be financially responsible, who does not know how to make and save money, take care of his expenses, or have resources to pay for his fast food splurges, his date money, or other such splurges, is still a boy.

This is perfectly fine if you're 13, but if you're 20, and still lacking in all these areas of knowledge and maturity, you're not "grown up," not ready for adult responsibilities or privileges, and has no right to be in charge of his own life yet.

A boy wastes hours on gaming and social media.

A man keeps time-wasting activities in check by taking care of his responsibilities first, and devoting extra time to things that will help him develop into a Man of Honor.

A boy expects everyone else to clean up his messes -- from his room to his financial issues.

A man manages his time, his space and his money in a way that's an example to others.

A boy defies authority and refuses to meet society's standards (either at school, work or home) for keeping things decent and in order.

A man takes charge of his realm, and leaves it better than he found it.

A friend of mine (let's call him Jeff) decided when he turned 17 that he was suddenly a man, and that his mother shouldn't demand that he clean his room, make his bed, or do his homework. Defiantly towering over her, he

challenged her to try and make him. She_left his room in tears.

When his father got home, he didn't say a word to Jeff. He took his suitcase from the closet and dropped it open on my friend's messy bed.

"Pack," his dad said.

"What?" Jeff answered, shocked.

"Pack your bag and go. If you're a man, go get a job, your own car, and an apartment. Go pay for your own food and movie tickets, and buy your own ieans and shoes from now on."

Jeff was silenced. Then he was ashamed of himself. He had to really humble himself and beg his dad not to throw him out, then tearfully apologize to his mom--he had hurt her feelings pretty badly.

Now, we don't condone the drastic measures Jeff's dad was about to take, but he had a good point. Jeff was certainly still a boy, unable to do any of those things on his own yet. And talking to his mother that was certainly the mark of immaturity.

Jeff joined the U.S. Army not long after that. How shocked he was to find himself being forced to do all those things he had resisted as a teenage boy. He found out the hard way in boot camp, with a drill sergeant yelling in his face, that a real man picks up after himself, and takes good care of his things. His mom wasn't going to be there to do it for him, that's for sure.

"That was the best thing that ever happened to me," he later recalled about all the reality checks he got in boot camp. "They made a real man out of me, by making all those things a part of my routine."

That's how a young man who always thought cleaning, making beds and cooking, were "women's work," or, at best, unnecessary. It's all a part of being self-sufficient or self-reliant -- knowing how to take care of yourself and your things is how you prove that you're a real man -- a Man of Honor!

TATTOOS & BODY PIERCING

God never condemns us, but always calls us to a higher life. If you already have tattoos or piercings, know that God loves you just like you are and does not condemn you. The best practice for a Man of Honor is to stay away from having your body marked or pierced or tattooed. Also understand that God has some standards for how we keep our bodies clean and clear of markings.

"Ye shall not make any cuttings in your flesh for the dead, nor print any marks upon you: I am the Lord." (Leviticus 19:28)

As I always say, "don't put bumpersticker on a sports car!" Similarly, God created you perfect, so no need to mar your body to look better. You're awesome just the way you are!

Often times, tattoos can cause others to see us in a negative light. Also, they are permanent. Never make a permanent decision about your body because you might change your mind later and really regret your choices. You can always change, but tattoos can't. They are there for life.

MORAL EXCELLENCE:

As you grow from a boy into a man, the most **PROMINENT**— changes you will see should be on the inside. If you pursue every aspect of being a Christlike man, you will develop into a man of moral excellence, above all else. Your word is your bond. You do all things for God's glory. You are the same man at church and at home. You are not afraid of exposure or **SCRUTINY**—, because your life is an open example of honesty, integrity, character and perseverance.




